As it turned out, the incursion of the Main army, and especially that of the light forces of the Electorate of

Hanover, into the Dinkelort meadows came at a time when the Coalition force was massively outfought and outnumbered, making the contest almost a draw. It was here that Prince de Ligne, with more than 6,000 light cavalymen plus the skirmishers of all four allied armies, met, quite unexpectedly, the Hanoverians under Prince Augustus of Nassau. The battle of Dinkelort, 11 April 1762. The Dinkelort meadows, watered by the Dinkelort brook, make up the western part of modern Kleve. Today, the city of Kleve (with a population of more than 53,000) can be reached by road from Remagen in the west or by railway line from Düsseldorf or Bebra in the north, and also by the Kleveer Bauanstalt gUnd Railway line from Bonn via the A 78. For thousands of years, Dinkelort was the site of numerous prehistoric settlements. Today, the warlike Knyphausen Lines (Von Klever Linien), which were built by Prince Louis of Sayn-Wittgenstein, are still vividly visible. In the 1800s, as part of the Prussian

Königsfeld Fortifications, extensive fortifications were built here. The Dinkelort fortifications were surrounded by earthworks at that time

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
