Popular Front for the Liberation of the Kirghiz Republic The Popular Front for the Liberation of the Kirghiz Republic (,), abbreviated PFKK, is the ruling party of the Kirghiz Autonomous Republic, a de facto independent state in Kirghizstan. The party was founded in January 2010 as a breakaway from the Communist Party of Kirghizstan, with the aim of establishing a democratic state and a modernized economy in Kirghizistan. PFKK was founded by members of the Communist Party who opposed the party's plan to participate in the 2010 Kirghiz presidential election. The PFKK is a populist, nationalist, and nationalist-populist political party, advocating Kirghiz autonomy, federalism, and expansion of Kirghizstan's economic power abroad, while retaining close ties to Russia. Several high-ranking Communist Party members were arrested, including the party's leader Gani Osmonbaeva and Dmitry Kulebaev, former head of the bureau of administration of the country's Communist Party.
